What is the objective of the Micro Grant Fund?


The Micro Grant Fund wishes to encourage and introduce economic examples that implement the sustainable co-existence of human and river: meet the specific demands of the land, increase biological diversity and promote the livelihoods of people of these areas. In brief: it supports sustainable farming projects that are small-scale but nevertheless can be great catalyzers of local social, economic development and environmental effects.

How does it operate?

The Micro Fund has been financed by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and the Hungarian Ministry of Environment and Water Affairs so far. Professional quality is assured by the Tisza Biodiversity Project which has been established by the financer institutions. The technical implementor is the Ökotárs Alapítvány (Partnership Foundation. The procedure of the selection of applications and the control of project implementation is presented in the diagram on page 10.

Reception in the media and among stakeholders

Despite the fact that the total amount of support is relatively low, the Fund has raised the extreme interest of farmers. People who are in a bad situation but are willing and able to help themselves (and also others) were given development support. The review of the Alliance for the Living Tisza entitled *Tiszavölgy* (Tisza Valley) gives quarterly reports on the results of the applications. The operation of the Micro Grant Fund contains great potential for media interest in Hungary as well as abroad.
